There is a beauty in being able to tell a story in a short time, (One line)certainly a challenge that filmmakers seem to truly enjoy.

Story to Script - a Journey.

Short and straight to the point.

Short film is a gateway to our dreams, a world of imagination transformed into moving images. Where from dreams come, look around and this is where they are.

The best short films are often a single moment that is played out, but one that has a story at its heart. (Everybody would like to listen stories. Most people watch films only to be told stories.)

Avoid stereotypes. Have a fresh point of view.

This is your chance to be as wild and creative as you want, so don't hesitate.

" Show, don't tell ". Film is about telling stories in pictures. Show as much information and visuals as you can in a short amount of time.

Keep less dialogue that to if it is required.

Body language speaks volumes!

The impact of page one is crucial to hook the reader.

Make a great first impression and show exactly who your character is in a compelling way.

Work towards a meaningful and satisfying ending.

Write what you are familiar with and what resonates with you. Do not shy away from small stories.

Avoid borrowing.

Choose a Short Script to tell a story with a beginning, a middle, and an end. Do not discard the practicalities of writing a script.

It may be also to generate debate and discussion on the issues when screened by different persons.

Create a Storyboard and determine the flow of the film and the sequence of its scenes.

Scout for Filming Locations, which would require permission from the owners.

Edit Your Film before you go to shooting.

Ideas are the simplest ones that grip an audience with emotion.

you do need to find a way to make your project original.

Write the most amazing story you can, full of rich characters and plot that moves the viewer emotionally. Make them remember your film long after the screen fades to black.

So, do it differently.

location, Budget, Actors, crew, time needed, permission for shooting outdoor .

Working with actors and the crew is also difficult

Whatever you planned wasn't shot .
